First Class& Second Class

We have been singing our little hearts out over the last two months learning songs such as '**The Whistling Gypsy'** and songs for our Christmas Concert. Second Class performed '**Somewhere only we know'** and '**Sleigh Ride'** while 1st class joined forces to perform '**Twelve days of Christmas'** and they recited the poem '**Twas' the night before Christmas'**. We have also began learning how to play the tin whistle with tunes such as the 'Siren song' and 'Hot cross buns'.

Following on from a successful Erasmus Week, first and second class decided to send pen pal letters to Greek pupils. Hopefully we will learn about how Christmas is celebrated in Greece when we receive the replies!

Back in November, to celebrate Science Week pupils explored the sense of sight by looking at optical illusions and spot the difference pictures, some pupils brought in binoculars, we made thaumatropes, we completed investigations that involved completing tasks with eyes open versus with eyes closed. We explored sound by making straw whistles and bottle music. We learned that children (and dogs) can hear higher frequencies than adults by taking a sound quiz. We conducted tests to see how good our sense of smell was and finally we tested our sense of touch by placing a range of items in a pillowcase and placing a sock over our hand and trying to quess what was inside the pillowcase, we then tried the same experiment without wearing the sock on our hand. We learned a lot about dogs' senses of smell, sight and sound. Pupils enjoyed the Scholastic Book Fair held in the halla.

In art, we have made clay pinch pots, created Salt-dough Christmas decorations (we linked this with the procedural writing genre in English), made penguins by means of potato printing and Styrofoam prints to make Christmas cards. In Religion, we created our own Advent calendar using old, empty matchboxes.

Pupils enjoyed a hot chocolate party as a reward for filling the kindness jar.

Second class are currently reading and enjoying a novel called 'One Wish'.

Science class also saw us designing and making safety jackets for eggs....the real fun was putting these safety jackets to the test by dropping our 'egg friends' from a height. There were many creative inventions made but unfortunately not all eggs survived the process!! The highlight of our PE classes was when we played games using our school parachute. The Maori People were a big focus of our learning in History and Art. The children were greatly mesmerized learning about how the Maori People created their facial Moko tattoos!! The song 'Walking in the Air' provided the backdrop to our Christmas art of making snowmen. The children thoroughly enjoyed practising their Christmas Concert songs to perform for you all, you can be very proud of them indeed.
