As a follow-on Science activity, children came up with lots of creative designs and drawings for non-slip shoes.

Having read about the Northern Lights in English, children created beautiful landscape artwork depicting the aurora borealis. Clay was used to sculpt Christmas stars – some children opted to create an ornament while others opted to create a star to hang on their Christmas Tree. We enjoyed listening to 'Walking in the Air' while using chalk pastels to create Flying Snowmen. There was also lots of laughter and fun while creating sock snowmen with rice this week.

A big highlight of November and December was our preparation for Scrooge – our Christmas Concert. Drama and Music classes took on a life of their own with children really stepping outside of their comfort zone to get into character. Children enjoyed

exploring different ways of using their voices and bodies to give a character a stronger sense of identity. We also had wonderful choreography being put together in class and on the yard to go with our songs. There was lots of excitement and healthy jitters before going on stage, the children had a ball performing for you all. Thanks for being such a great audience.

In History, we have been learning a lot about our school in the past. Examining the old roll books captured the children's minds and imaginations – some looking for relatives and some in awe of the beautiful cursive handwriting of decades gone by.
